

## Improved Workflow of the Clean Workplace Support Program

### - Abolition of supplier subsidies and exemption from investment consulting -

Program	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● <b>Clean Workplace Support</b></li> </ul>
Major changes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● <b>For all projects:</b>  <p>In order for amicable budget control of Clean Workplace program during an year, the amount determined for available subsidy could be maximum 120% or less (including the amount carry-over from the earlier year) of the budget per program category*</p> <p>* Clean Workplace Support program consist of 4 projects : Clean Certification, Fall Prevention, High-risk Reduction, and Prevention at Industrial Complex</p> </li> <li>● <b>Delegation of supplier subsidy system</b> is no longer available</li> <li>● For “Clean Certification” project: New deadlines introduced for <b>fair allocation of budget</b> (now received on a certain date for each quarter, instead of year-round)</li> <li>● For “Clean Certification” project: Businesses that receive consulting from designated safety and health agencies may <b>substitute for</b> investment consulting</li> <li>● For “Clean Certification” project: Subsidies for pallet racks and other such products subject to the sunset <b>system</b>, due to their relative ineffectiveness in preventing workplace accidents, are no longer available</li> <li>● For “Clean Certification” and “High-risk Reduction” projects: Projects with an estimated <b>construction cost of about 8,900 USD</b> or more each are now required to submit cost estimates produced by agencies specialized in costing</li> <li>● For “Fall Prevention” projects: The range of fall-preventing safety products eligible for subsidies (ladder-type work stools) has been expanded</li> </ul>

	<p>* Subsidies are available for up to two ladder-type work stools per site</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● <b>For “Fall Prevention” projects:</b> The process has been changed so that business owners now have to apply for subsidies separately after requesting the completion of investment</li> <li>● <b>For “High-risk Reduction” projects:</b> Subsidies for these projects are to be made available twice a year only <b>(based on the date which determines subsidy amount)</b></li> <li>● <b>For “High-risk Reduction” projects:</b> The types of equipment eligible for subsidies have been reduced to <b>23 types</b> <p>* These are 23 types of “facilities and equipment recognized and designated by KOSHA as necessary for reducing hazards and risks toward preventing fatal accidents.”</p> </li> <li>● <b>Follow-up technical instruction:</b> Now provided by not only contracted agencies but also KOSHA. <p>* Specifics of instruction, including durations and methods, are to be announced later.</p> </li> </ul>
